Annual Judged Photo Show in March

This year's Spring Photo Show has been moved to March instead of April in order to make room for a solo show by Robyn Goudy that will open in May. We'll tell you more about Robyn's show in an upcoming issue of the Chaparral Sketch.

Chaparral Artists' Spring Photo Show is open to all photographers and there is no limit on the number of entries that a person can have. Youth and adult entries will not

compete against each other except for Best of Show and People's Choice awards. Age will be a factor in choosing winners in the youth category. Members of Chaparral Artists who have paid their dues and all young artists who have not graduated high school will pay a \$10.00 entry fee for their first photograph and \$5.00 for each additional entry. Non-members will pay a \$10.00 entry fee for each submission. However; if they would like to become a member the membership is \$25.00 for one person and \$35.00 per couple with \$5.00 for each additional family member. (We don't charge a membership fee for young artists who haven't graduated from high school.)

Each category will have subcategories of birds, other animals, landscapes, people, man-made, sunrise/sunset, flowers, plants & trees, still life, insects, and other. We will combine groups if there are less than three entries in any category/subcategory.

You can turn in your photographs at A Roadside Attraction either on Thursday, March 14 between 4 and 6 p.m. or Friday, March 15 between 10:30 and noon. **No entries will be accepted after noon on Friday without prior approval of the show committee.**

Everyone is invited to attend the awards ceremony and reception on Sunday, March 17 from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

This show will run through April 10.

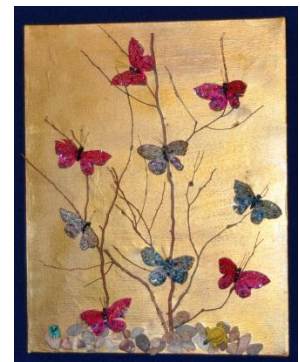

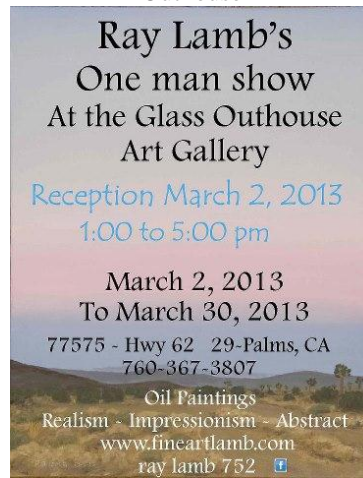
