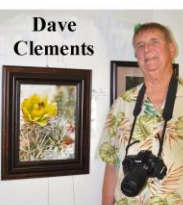

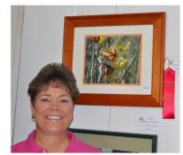

## Joshua Tree National Park

First the Native Americans were here. Then in the late 1800s the cattlemen arrived followed by miners looking for gold. In the 1930s homesteaders came seeking free land and a new life.

In 1936 this portion of the Mojave and Colorado Deserts, larger than the state of Rhode Island, became a National

Monument. Some long-time residents still call it “The Monument” even though it became a National Park in 1994.

This unique park attracts tourists from all over the world including countries such as Germany, Japan, and Sweden; just to name a few.

The park inspires artists and may be the reason that so many live near it.

The Joshua Tree National Park Association helps support artists by providing numerous artistic events and classes each year. Artwork by some of our local artists is also available in the park’s gift shops.

## The Glass Outhouse Gallery

Many of you may not know that Laurel Seidl, owner of the Glass Outhouse Gallery, was an artist. Nowadays instead of creating art Laurel uses her artistic abilities to help others promote their work.

In 2008 artist Robyn Goudy turned one of Laurel's old rabbit houses into a fine art gallery. Leaving the outside of the building looking old and weathered the modern interior

comes as a pleasant surprise to first time visitors. In addition to the gallery there are quite a few things to see outside. In addition to the glass outhouse, which gave the gallery its name, there is a path that takes you past many interesting sights and vignettes ranging from a couple of skeletal banjo players to a small nondenominational chapel.

A new art show is held every month with the exception of July and August. Besides seeing work by local artists reception attendees are entertained by local musical talent. The Glass Outhouse Gallery is so popular that there is a long waiting list for those wishing to be featured artists.

The Glass Outhouse is located at 77575 Twentynine Palms Hwy. at the corner of Thunder Road in Wonder Valley just 3 1/2 miles east of Utah Trail.

## The Hi-Desert Nature Museum

Often overlooked; the Hi-Desert Nature Museum is a great place to see art by local artists both past and present.

Celebrating its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary the museum was founded in 1964 by Evelyn Conklin; her father, Percy Conklin; Camilla Hudson, a long-time resident; and Jerry Moore, Community Services Director of the Parks and Recreation District. In 1991 when the town of Yucca Valley incorporated the museum became a division of the Community Services Department.

The Hi-Desert Nature Museum has been dedicated to helping the citizens of the Morongo Basin and High Desert discover the rich cultural heritage and natural history of

this area. Generations of school children, students, and museum visitors have relied on the museum to inform, inspire, interpret, and entertain.

Among the many exhibits visitors have been treated to are the annual Yucca Valley High School Art Show, the Art Tours Collective Show, and the Reduce. Reuse, Recycle and Wild Creatures Shows.

The museum is located in the Yucca Valley Community Center Complex at 57116 Twentynine Palms Highway in Yucca Valley and is open Thurs. – Sat. from 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. as well as for special events. Admission is free.
