For those of you not familiar with the object of the show it's fairly simple. One person, or several, can create different interpretations or images of the same or similar thing. In prior years some entries have included paintings by various artists who painted the same subject in an art class, photographs and paintings of the same thing by different people, and groupings of similar subjects in different mediums.

I use images by current Chaparral Artists members for the background of our show flyers but for this show I've made an exception with a photograph by a former member.

Several months ago I received a photograph from former Chaparral Artists member, and past president, Bruce Miller. It was a picture of a grazing horse and when I saw it I immediately thought of the "Same But Different" Show. (Yes, I think about subjects for this show throughout the year.) This is NOT a judged show and it's free of charge to all Chaparral Artists members and youth artists through 12th grade. We are hoping to get submissions of artwork of various types with each artist's interpretation of the subject of their choice.


Since this isn't a judged show it doesn't matter if you have shown it previously.


