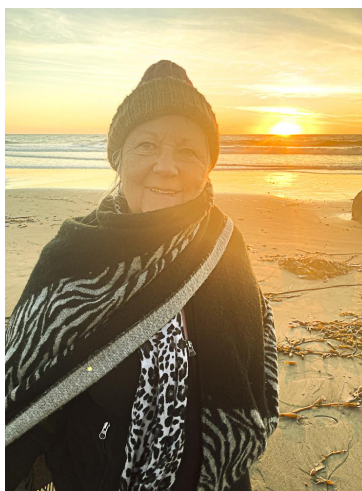

### General Meetings

Our November meeting was held on the 14th of the month and it was amazing. We had thirteen (13) members attend the meeting and we sped through the general announcements quickly so that we might enjoy our guest speaker/demonstrator, Glenn Grishkoff. Member announcements were made to include the Landers Craft Fair held on second Saturdays from 10am-2pm at Belfield Hall. December 10th will be their next Craft Fair, perfectly timed for gift shopping! Membership dues for 2023 were requested, and Nancy Kimes received the door prize of a Chaparral cloth tote bag.

Glenn Grishkoff, our guest demonstrator and speaker is an eclectic, creative, and focused artist who works with multiple mediums. A California based artist and professor, he shared with attendees examples of his work. Providing extensive and beautiful albums of art created in both controlled and uncontrolled - natural - environments, his work is exciting and fearless. Glenn also creates his own brushes that are both beautiful,

natural, and working tools. The handmade brushes are often made from natural materials, utilizing responsibly collected feathers and fur, decorative salvaged trinkets if/when they ‘fit’ the spirit of the brush, and handles from recycled materials or branches straight off the tree. Clearly there is preparation time in all things, but the end result felt so fresh and at one with nature that I was in awe of the loveliness. Many participants stayed long past 3pm in discussion with Glenn Grishkoff.

Our LAST meeting of 2022 will be our Holiday gathering on Monday the 12th of December at 1:00 PM where we will hold our much enjoyed pig-n-the-poke, a greeting card contest and an ornament contest - all for fun, and we’ll get the opportunity to share updates and stories with each other. Though we do not have a contest for over the top holiday sweaters, feel free to dress up in a festive way for the meeting if you want!

Contests - these are fun and simple ways to showcase your artistic flair in the smaller forms of card and decoration. An ode to those seasonal missives and decorative considerations that you make to your home during the holidays. Some of our members are versed in creating these joyous small works of art already, while others might consider taking the step into a new adventure. Feel free to share something you haven’t yet shared during our Holiday party as well. We do not have a date-creation limit on these contests, we just ask that you haven’t submitted the pieces in the past.

Pig-n-the-Poke - a guessing game, a way to donate gently used, possibly forgotten art and home goodies, an opportunity to give a little something and to enjoy the paper messes created during the unbagging, unboxing, or unwrapping. This plain paper wrapped, quirky hint attached, gift presentation is something Chaparral has partaken in for years. Members bring in goodies (preferably valued below \$30). Those that are especially adept at writing riddles probably have the most fun... or is that me that simply enjoys reading them? Silent bidding is done by marking up the last bid placed. It’s a little crazy and it certainly isn’t meant to make money, though final bids will go to Chaparral. The event is timed and when time is up, the highest bidder gets the bag or box.

We invite members and their guests to bring packaged sweets or food that pair nicely with such warm comfort drinks, snackable foods, if homemade, should remain covered. ### ***Previous Exhibit***

Members can also come up with their own collection of art pieces that work together in obvious and sometimes curious ways! The idea is to push the limits of what this theme might entail while still providing a place for the sharing of works created with friends in a workshop environment OR presenting a cooperative compilation of similar subjects that spark joy for multiple individuals.

We received a total of thirty-eight (38) entries from ten (10) artists, making this a beautiful display of color, medium, and spirit.

### ***Upcoming Exhibit***

In December we will hang the last “Anything Goes” members-only show of 2022. This theme, or

lack thereof, truly fits anything. It is not limited by the age of work, subject, or style, though we can truly only feature two dimensional works, preferably limited to 20x24 in size.

Intake for the “Anything Goes” show will be held at Rainbow Stew on the 15th and 16th of December—a Thursday from 4:30-6pm and a Friday from 12:30-2pm. As always, let’s have fun with this! There are no fees for this show, but your membership dues must be current.

You are allowed to submit a single piece, thereby ensuring that a marvelous selection of artists across the Morongo Basin can showcase their work to visitors. I highly recommend subscribing to the PAAC newsletter as each of their shows are announced with ample time to participate and they include information about what sparked the theme of the quarter. Also included are the requirements for submission and they are stepping up their game with a request for artist biographies, and a brief statement on how your entry fits the theme.

The previous show titled “Desert Journeys” will be on display up to the 13th of January, 2023. If you haven’t been able to view the current show, take this opportunity to enjoy local art AND review the gallery space you might wish to show YOUR art in! Open Wednesday-Sunday, 10-4pm.
