### **Gallery Displays**

#### ***Previous Exhibit***

The December exhibit was on display from December 16 to January 11 and it was our open themed “Anything Goes”. With no limit on age of creation, the number of times you have shared it in a previous show, or on a particular theme that it must fit, members can share their favorite results of a particular medium, theme, time of year, or even their most cherished friends.

We received a total of thirty (30) entries from twelve (12) artists, making this another beautiful display of color, medium, and energy.

#### ***Upcoming Exhibit***

In January we will hang the first members-only show of 2023 themed “Amóre”. This theme is open to primarily two-dimensional creations that can safely hang on the wall. We typically cannot properly feature three-dimensional works because we do not have the room to place pedestals, we cannot provide our own pedestals, and we are unable to protect those pieces from being moved around if/when they are displayed. There is no limitation to the age of work, the style of creation, or the medium, as long as the entries encapsulate LOVE to you. And let me share that there are plenty of ways to encapsulate love, adoration, and sweetness in a picture! The cuddling of creatures will always be a favorite of mine, as will mothers and children. Friendship, acts of caring, still life bouquets of flowers and candy, the lucky snapshot of heart-shapes in nature, or the abstracted color choices and shapes that represent love *for you*. These all present such a reason to smile. How will you present love in the next show?

Intake for the “Amóre” show will be held at Rainbow Stew on the 12th and 13th of January - a Thursday from 4:30-6pm and a Friday from 12:30-2pm. As always, let’s have fun with this! There are no fees for this show, but your membership dues must be current. The show hangs during a time where people might be looking for gifts for their loved ones!

You are allowed to submit a single piece, thereby ensuring that a marvelous selection of artists across the Morongo Basin can showcase their work to visitors. I highly recommend subscribing to the PAAC newsletter as each of their shows are announced with ample time to participate and they include information about what sparked the theme of the quarter. Also included are the requirements for submission and they are stepping up their game with a request for artist biographies, and a brief statement on how your entry fits the theme.

The previous show titled “Desert Journeys” will be on display up to the 13th of January, 2023. If you haven’t been able to view the current show, take this opportunity to enjoy local art AND review the gallery space you might wish to show YOUR art in! Open Wednesday-Sunday, 10-4pm.
