The reception and awards ceremony will be on Sunday, April 27 from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

Fees: Members of Chaparral Artists who have paid their 2014 dues and kindergarten thru 12th grade students - \$15.00 for first entry, \$10.00 for second entry. All other artists - \$15.00 per entry

On the road again to the Las Vegas Creative Painting Convention at the Tropicana Hotel. This year's convention was held February 23 – 28th. Nancy Miehle, Carol Snyder, Jan & Jim Melchert, Carolyn Tober (my roommate) and I made the trek. Once again a motorcycle escort cleared my way to Stateline. A big thanks to my husband Pete and Jim Williams for the company. The weather was beautiful considering there was a reported major storm front coming in.

Carolyn and I were scheduled to take the two-day Pre-Convention still life class taught by Robert Warren. We arrived Friday afternoon, organized our room and painting supplies and

anxiously awaited our Saturday & Sunday 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. class. This was my 5th year attending the convention and this class was one of the best I've attended. The class was extra nice because it was held at the beginning of the convention and all of the students were rested, refreshed and ready to go. I took a total of 9 classes during the week (I felt like I had taken 9)—all but 2 acrylic classes were worth the effort. As I say to everyone that thinks I'm a little nuts to take that many "I come here to paint!" All of us were so busy attending classes and scheduling other activities off-site that we were surprised when we found each other in a class. I was fortunate to be in several of Jan's classes and one of Nancy and Carol's too. We kept running into each other on the elevator, hallway or artists café. As the convention came to an end the biggest surprise to me was finding out that Nancy and Carol were Carolyn and my next-door neighbors.

Wednesday morning at 9 a.m. the convention floor opened for business to a sea of artists waiting to get in. **Only attendees** of the convention can shop from 9-12 on the first day. The rest of the time the public can attend for a fee. The convention floor was a multi-artist's paradise—something for everyone. The most recent products on the market were demonstrated and enticed the shoppers to purchase. It was nice to speak to the vendors and artists that use the products available. The artists shared ideas and secrets to their success. Unfortunately because of the major storm that arrived, the convention closed down early on Friday so that the vendors could safely prepare for the return trip home. On a good

note the instructors on Friday allowed their students to go to the convention floor and finish up their shopping before finishing their scheduled classes.

This year there were 815 in attendance and 94 instructors. There was a very nice variety of classes to choose from: 73 acrylic; 9 watercolor; 18 oil; 18 misc. medias; 9 pencil; 7 theory; 6 sponsored events; 9 8-hour intensive study and 10 retro classes (taught in the past). There were two pre classes and 5 post classes too.

Coming home was a bit of a challenge because of the incoming storm front. Nancy and Carol were heading back to Yucca early on Saturday morning so I followed them taking the Kelso/Amboy route. Fortunately we received a lot of information regarding road closures and clearings through home contacts and Caltrans Road Conditions. Jan and Jim left shortly after us and took the Barstow route. We all arrived home safely and tired from our non-stop week. For those of you that travel locally or afar one of the favorite numbers I keep on my cell phone is Caltrans Road Conditions.
