### ***Previous Exhibit - Creativity***

In December, we held our judged exhibit, an all mediums combined show open to submissions from anyone. The exhibit is on display at Rainbow Stew in Yucca Valley. Featuring eighteen (18) entries from six (6) creators, the exhibit is on display between December 13, 2025 and January 14, 2026. It turned out to be another smaller judged show and because of that, the entire show was judged as a single category. Though we try to arrange entries into multiple categories, we always give the invited judge the option to treat the show as hung in categories OR as a single group of submissions if they choose.

Our judge, Wendy Sherman, Wendy Sherman is a curator, arts manager, and graphic artist. She has managed galleries in Pasadena and Los Angeles's Chinatown Arts District and has curated exhibitions throughout Los Angeles and Orange County since

2014. Her projects include the traveling exhibition *Hearsay: Artists Reveal Urban Legends*, featuring 37 artists. Wendy has served on several arts boards and holds a BFA from CalArts and an MFA from CSU Fullerton.

### **Artists of the Month**

We feature Chaparral members at both the Desert Hills Presbyterian Church in Yucca Valley AND AquaFit in Yucca Valley. We do not control when these venues open, so calling in advance to a visit is recommended.

During December 2025 through January 2026, Desert Hills Presbyterian Church in Yucca Valley is pleased to feature the artwork of **Linda Chollar**. Linda's work is richly textured and deeply sensory, drawing inspiration from nature's quiet power—from the sands beneath our toes to the swirling dust and expansive skies above. Her pieces often incorporate layered surfaces and subtle dimensional elements, inviting viewers to slow down, look closely, and experience a sense of grounding and calm. The palette and textures evoke meditation, connection, and the natural rhythms of the earth. We invite you to stop by sometime in January to experience her work before it moves on to its next exhibit.

On display until the end of January, **Nancy Miehle** is showcasing her art at AquaFit. Nancy presents a display featuring large oil paintings inspired by the desert and the ocean. Her work

highlights gentle landscapes and friendly animal subjects, brought to life with confident brushstrokes. While Nancy works in several mediums, this exhibit focuses on her oil paintings, where her style feels both soft and expressive. Her warm, inviting color palette reflects the beauty of our surrounding regional home. Be sure to stop by and enjoy her latest work.

## Creative Opportunities

### *Workshops and Paint-outs*

There are numerous chances to make art in the Morongo Basin, whether by enjoying solitude, joining plein air sessions and writing opportunities, or participating in group projects, creative workshops, photography trips, and writers' groups.

Over the course of two Saturdays, participants will create a small collection of original clay pieces from start to finish. On the first day, each student will receive clay to roll out, cut into shapes using a variety of tools, and form up to four unique pieces. Stamps and mini-rollers will be used to add texture and personal detail.

#### What to Expect:

On the first day, each student will receive a piece of clay and learn to roll it flat, cut out shapes using various tools, and create up to four unique pieces. You'll then use stamps or mini-rollers to add texture and detail.



During the second session, you'll paint and complete your pieces in preparation for the final glaze

Only 10 spots are available—sign up soon to secure your place in this fun and creative workshop!

The second session will focus on painting and finishing your work in preparation for glazing. Nancy will glaze and fire all completed pieces and bring them to the February meeting for pickup.

Only 10 spots are available, making this a rare and special opportunity to learn and create in a small group. We encourage you to sign up quickly to secure your place!

**Mil-Tree Writers Group** meets Monday evenings, online via Zoom, 7-9pm. This writing group welcomes individuals of all writing levels and fosters a relaxed and friendly environment. The primary expectation is that members are open to providing feedback on their peers' writing, but all are

**Open Arts & Crafts Workshops** are offered at the Yucca Valley Community Center on Thursday mornings, 10-12:30pm. Participants bring their own materials, pay a fee of \$3, and are able to work on whatever they are interested in.

**Watercolor Workshops** are offered at the Yucca Valley Community Center most Thursday afternoons, 1-3pm. Participants bring their own materials, pay a fee of \$5, and can work on their own watercolor projects or follow along with the instructor.

**Watercolor Workshops** are offered at the AquaFit in Yucca Valley most Friday mornings, 9-11am. Participants bring their own materials, pay a fee of \$10, and can work on their own watercolor projects or follow along with the instructor. *Visit instagram @watercolor.yv or Facebook by searching for watercolor.yv or contact Raini directly to confirm workshop days, as she often travels!!*

**Plein Air meetups**, organized by Krista Wargo, happen in the desert almost every month and are listed on the Chaparral calendar once confirmed. Participants bring their own art supplies, prepare for weather changes, and bring enough food and water for painting outdoors. Locations chosen by Krista have basic amenities like restrooms, but you need to bring everything else you need.
